

Rainbows at Collier

After being a part of the Rainbows program here at Collier Street United Church since 2001, I have decided to officially "retire." This was a very difficult decision for me not only because this is a program that I truly believe in but it also means that the Rainbows program at Collier has come to an end. There is always hope that someone, someday will want to start up at another time but for now, it is on a break.

Rainbows For All Children is a peer learning program that was introduced to Collier Street United Church by Thelma Cockburn in 1992. At that time, Thelma was a teacher at Codrington Public School and was searching for a program to help her students deal positively with feelings related to divorce or death within their families. Thelma discovered Rainbows in the U.S. and then introduced a program at Collier as the first community site in the Barrie area. She and my uncle Jack Cain approached the official board here at Collier for the funding for supplies and the rest is history.

Since that time, the Rainbows program has been fully funded by you, the congregation. I don't have any records from 1992 to 2002 but after that time, it appears that we have helped over 600 participants, had at least 65 trained facilitators and at least 10 student helpers. Many of the facilitators volunteered year after year and even some of the students did a few years of volunteer service as well. Most of our facilitators were members here at Collier and then they brought in friends and we were able to source community volunteers too. Many of our facilitators over the years either had children take part in the program at some point or were even participants themselves in their youth and wanted to "give back".

We had wonderful feedback over the years from the parents and even though some of the children were hesitant to come at first as this was all a new experience for them, they developed strong bonds with their leader and the other children in their groups.

I want to thank each and every one of you for your loving support and I send a special thank you to all of the facilitators who truly made a difference in so many of these family's lives. We called ourselves "loving listeners." There was no judgement as these families grieved together, learned new coping skills and learned to live new "normal" lives in a safe and loving environment. We helped them feel better about themselves, to learn that they weren't alone in their grief and encouraged them to just "let it all out". Rainbows encourages families to move from hurt through healing to hope and I feel that we at Collier were a large part in helping them to do that.

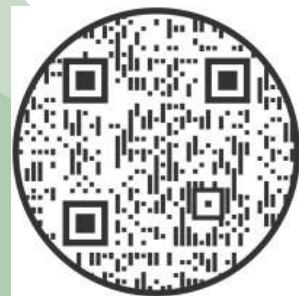

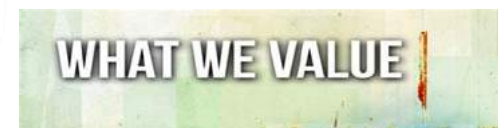
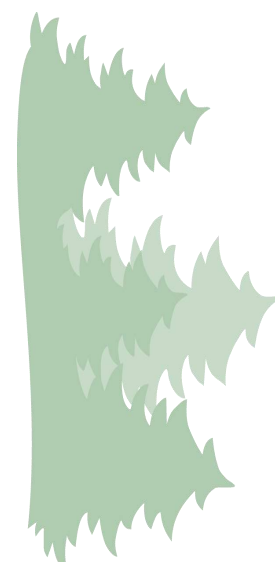
ually need to celebrate ourselves for continuing to be active, relevant and committed to the mission of our congregation.

Regional Conference Report

The Regional Meeting was held on November 13, 2021, virtually due to the Pandemic restrictions in place for a second year. The meeting began promptly at 9:00 am and was chaired by the President, Dr. David Leyton-Brown, whose time was extended because of the pandemic. Following introductions, we held a time of worship led by Rev. Dr. Susan Eagle (Grace United) which included a musical portion featuring our own Sandra Ruttan. The Toronto Urban Native Ministries with Rev. Evan Swance-Smith brought Indigenous greetings to begin the meeting.

Social & Ecological Justice - In the morning we voted to continue the mandate of the Social & Ecological Justice Commission. The policies of social justice that Collier supports, arise partly from the good work being done in this commission, (along with our hard-working Minister and committee).

Human Rights Issue - The second motion involved the work being done to support human rights issues in Israel-Palestine regarding where the church generally supports investments that positively relate to this issue.

Finances - The Region's financial report involved the usual necessary details that arise out of any large organizational needs. It was interesting to see that Shining Waters is the largest and wealthiest region in Canada.

Assessment by Eric Mathieson - The Executive Officer of Finance from our General Council, reminded all local churches of the importance of giving to Mission and Service as this directly lowers our Annual Assessment and is a charitable method for saving the church necessary funds.

Proposals being forwarded to the General Council - The afternoon session was spent with examining nine proposals that had been submitted for consideration by the Region, to be passed on to General Council. While some of these motions were administrative there were three of particular interest. The Region overwhelmingly voted to support the position of the UCC in calling for the decriminalization of illicit substances for personal use and a policy of harm reduction. The Region also voted to support a strong policy of self-care for ministerial personnel, anti-bullying policy and support for clergy on the Discontinued Service List.

Transfer of Leadership - The day was completed when Dr. David Leyton-Brown was thanked for his lengthy service to Presbytery and Region and Rev. Betty Lou McNabb was invested as our new Regional President.
